Minutes: October 5, 2023

Baby, Wall hanging, Art quilt, Beginner – must be quilting less than 2 years, Miniature – smaller than 24 inches on all sides; Applique; Mixed techniques; Pieced – size small to medium; Pieced – size large to extra-large;

Solo quilt – I did it all by myself;

Other items – pillow, tuffet, tree skirt, jacket, basket, rug, etc.

Found and finished – any quilt top that you found, bought, was given to you AND you finished.
