She suggests making one block for yourself and one (or more) for the guild – then you will have a quilt top by the end of the year of your own out of these patterns. AM BOM winner was Margaret Baldwin. PM BOM winner was Jonel Hammons.

KCRQF – Diane Burnett & Nancy Hart-Kline encouraged everyone to set up their account online for all purchases (including tickets) & to sign up for volunteer opportunities. The volunteer signup timeslots will open soon – the earlier you sign up for the jobs you are interested in, the more likely you will find openings. Our guild is in charge of Judged Quilts again – so our experienced hangers & helpers are needed. Please look for an email & sign up ASAP. Laura Davids reminds everyone that has signed up to provide quilts for our guild display – she will pick those up at the June meeting to take to KCRQF the next week. They will all need to have a 4-inch sleeve (for hanging) – which must be sewn on (no safety pins). Laura will NOT put them on. They also need to have a label, which does not need to be permanent.

Charity / Disaster quilts – Dianna Cook modeled the Hug Quilts, we need 15 – 20 hug quilts for local nursing homes (kits are available). The nursing homes would also like lap quilts – approximately 32" x 45" & remember to use materials that are machine washable (as all items are washed in hot water). Ginger Vail reported that she has been able to give 3 quilts to the Sheriff's Department for distribution since our last meeting & received another completed quilt at the evening meeting. But please keep them coming.

Scholarship – Sharon Schroeder has one application from Louisburg, the deadline is April 15th, 2025.

Committee Chair – We need a nominating committee for 2026 as we have multiple positions that will need to be filled – VP of Membership for both AM & PM, PM President, & PM Secretary. Brenda Mosley has volunteered for one of the three committee members needed. If interested, please let us know.
